Call for Papers

The Qur'ānic Linguistics Research Group (QLG) is delighted to announce that it will be hosting its Inaugural International Conference on Qur'ānic linguistics in collaboration with SOAS Centre of Islamic Studies on 14th-15th March 2023. The conference will be held online via Zoom.

QLG is a group of Quranic studies scholars whose research focuses on the dynamics and mechanisms of the Qur'ān as a communicative text from a linguistic standpoint. We aim to promote academic excellence in this study area through various research activities. QLG's Inaugural International Conference

will bring together academics worldwide to showcase the latest advances in Qur'anic linguistics research.

Conference Themes

We welcome particularly papers applying modern linguistic theories to the Qur'anic text in the following areas:

- 1. Application of linguistic theories and approaches to analysing the Qur'ānic text, including, Pragmatics, Relevance Theory, Speech Acts Theory, Text Linguistics, Systemic Functional Linguistics, and linguistic analyses of coherence and cohesion issues.
- 2. Discourse analysis: Linguistic analysis of Qur'ānic discourse types such as narratives, dialogues, polemics, and hymns.
- 3. Linguistic analysis of Qur'ānic themes and textual structures.
- 4. Qur'ānic grammar and syntax, including particles, issues in agreement, word order, sentence structure and types of verbs.
- 5. Analyses of phonology and morphology in the Qur'an.
- 6. Time and aspect issues (e.g. gnomic present).
- 7. Linguistic and grammatical material in Qur'ānic exegeses.
- 8. Qur'anic material in modern and classical Arabic linguistics and philology.
- 9. Semantics, including lexemes, lexical units and fields, homonymy, polysemy and Lexical Networks.
- 10. Various approaches to the linguistic analysis of Qur'ān translations.
- 11. Comparison of grammatical and rhetorical structures in Semitic texts, including Biblical Hebrew and the Qur'ān.
- 12. The impact of Qur'ānic variant readings on the production of meaning and grammatical structures.
- 13. Qur'ānic hermeneutics from a linguistic point of view.
- 14. Linguistics in 'Ulum al-Qur'ān and Usul al-Fiqh.
